- Government Utility
  - State Constitution

  - 6 Member Board of Trustees (3 City & 3 County)
- Two utilities: Wastewater & Stormwater
- 520 square mile service area
  - All of St. Louis City
  - 87% of St. Louis County
- ~1,300,000 customers
- 88 municipalities served

- 7 Treatment Plants
- 350+ million gallons per day of wastewater treated
- 4,700+ miles of wastewater sewers
- 1,800+ miles of combined sewers
- 3,000+ miles of stormwater sewers
- 4th largest sewer system in the United States (as measured by miles of sewers handling wastewater)

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
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### **Project Overview**

- Origin of Project
   The project was identified to alleviate
   wastewater sewer surcharging and basement back ups. The existing sewer is undersized.
- Project Goal
   Construction of a larger wastewater sewer with capacity to alleviate back ups in the area
- Benefits
   Reduction of basement back-ups





wastewater + stormwater

- Approximately 1,170 feet
- Depth of 12 to 15 feet
- Pipe size increases to 15-inch

#### How it will be built



- Open-Cut Excavation should be anticipated throughout the project area.
- Heavy construction equipment should be anticipated – backhoes, skid loaders, dump trucks, etc.

## What can residents expect?



- Easements for access to private property and for construction of the new sewer will be required.
- Traffic impacts include the temporary closing of Marshall Ave., west of North Laclede Station Rd. To a lesser extent, traffic on Clark Ave., Yeatman Ave., and Brookside Ave. will also be impacted.
- Property owner access may be temporarily impeded
  - Contractor required to maintain access





#### **Tentative Construction Schedule**

- Easement Acquisition Summer 2023
- Design Completion Summer 2022
- Estimated start date Summer 2024
- Estimated duration One Year
