



Project Overview



- General Goal
 - Reduce overland flooding by improving stormwater drainage in this area
- Project Scope
 - Install approximately 7,700 feet of new storm sewer pipe
- Benefits
 - Reduced frequency and severity of home, yard and street flooding

Tentative Construction Schedule



• Start: Winter 2025

• End: Fall 2027

Construction schedule is subject to change based on weather, utility conflicts, supply chain problems, and other unforeseen issues.

Previous Public Engagement



October 2020 – Neighborhood Public Meeting

What can residents expect?



- Trenches or "open-cut" excavation
- Tunneling
- Construction noise during normal business hours
- Traffic control plan and access issues
 - Lane and road closures will temporarily affect traffic
 - Temporary access restrictions to residential properties
 - Contractor will notify property owners before access restrictions



How will it look when construction is finished?

- Trenches backfilled soon after pipe is installed
 - Roadway and sidewalk restoration
 - Private property restoration per easement



Frequently Asked Questions



- Will this work disrupt sewer or other utility services?
- Will trees be removed as part of this project?
- Will construction affect access to my driveway?
- Will emergency vehicles have access to my property during construction?


